Conference Report

Professional Development Report

TESL Saskatchewan provided a variety of professional development opportunities for members and non-members throughout the year.

In September, Urbashi Raha led participants through an exploration of translanguaging as an inclusive classroom methodology for supporting bilingual and multilingual learners, with critical reflection on native-speaker ideology and its implications for language teaching.

In November, faculty and teacher trainees from the BA Applied Linguistics: TESOL program at Briercrest College led an interactive session on academic integrity, inviting the audience to examine the topic from linguistic, cultural, and ethical perspectives.

In February, Ali Caszadeh Matakhi presented a pilot framework for embedding AI ethically in the language classroom through scenario-based learning, reflective tasks, and curricular integration.

Though there's been a wide range of uncertainty over the last year within our field, it's encouraging to see the continued desire for excellence within our practices as we gather to learn and discuss. We look forward to many more opportunities to grow and network together in the coming year.

Accreditation Report

Throughout 2025, the Accreditation Committee continued to support TESL SK members by reviewing accreditation and re-accreditation applications from both new and existing members. In addition to processing submissions, the Committee actively assisted current and prospective members by responding to inquiries regarding accreditation requirements, eligibility criteria, and the application process.

TESL SK is proud to have developed and strengthened a provincial accreditation system that upholds high professional standards and aligns closely with TESL Canada accreditation requirements. Members accredited through TESL SK since 2018 are eligible to apply for TESL Canada accreditation through the streamlined agreement established between TESL Canada and TESL SK.

Members are also reminded of the importance of maintaining active accreditation status. Re-accreditation applications must be submitted every five years. To qualify for re-accreditation, members are required to provide documentation of at least 25 hours of relevant professional development activities completed within the five-year period. This requirement helps ensure that accredited members remain informed about current developments, best practices, and emerging trends in the TESL field.

The Accreditation Committee remains committed to supporting TESL SK's mission by fostering a transparent and rigorous accreditation process. We continue to welcome constructive feedback from members to strengthen our practices and respond to the evolving needs of the sector.

I would like to thank the current members of the Accreditation Committee for their dedication, professionalism, and ongoing commitment to supporting our members throughout the year.
